



Drone Policy

Out of safety concerns for guests, employees, and resort property, as well as concerns for individual privacy, Granby Ranch prohibits the operation or use of unmanned aerial systems, or drones, by the general public – including recreational users and hobbyists – without the prior written authorization from the Resort. This prohibition includes drones used for filming or videotaping, as well as any drone use by media or journalists operating above or within Granby Ranch private property boundaries. This prohibition on drone operations or use extends to any drones launched or operated from Granby Ranch property, as well as drones launched from private property outside of Granby Ranch private property boundaries. Please contact a resort representative (Greg Finch COO or Jamie Wolter Director of Mountain Operations) if you have any questions or if you seek prior authorization to operate any aerial drones. Any authorized operation of aerial drones may be governed by Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) rules and regulations, local law enforcement, as well as those policies separately established by Granby Ranch, which may include certification, training, insurance coverage, indemnification requirements, and waivers or releases of liability. Any violation of this policy may at Granby Ranch discretion, involve suspension of your activity privileges, such as skiing, biking or fishing, and or the revocation of your ticket, season pass etc., as well as confiscation of any drone equipment, and may subject violators to any damages, including, but not limited to, damages for violations of privacy and/or physical or personal injuries or property damage, as well as regulatory fines and legal fees.

Policy once written approval is granted:

- Drone operators must sign a release of liability waiver and indemnification agreement and accept responsibility for any and all damages or incidents resulting from Drone use on Granby Ranch property. Including but not limited to damage of aerial lifts, buildings, vehicles, equipment, employees, guests and collisions between guests.
- Drones must not exceed an operational height of 200 vertical feet above the ground.
- Drones must never fly above any of our aerial or surface lifts and must remain at least 150 feet of horizontal distance away from all our aerial and surface lifts.
- If the drone being used requires FAA licensing a copy of that license will be provided to Granby Ranch.
- Commercial drone operators must provide a copy of their general liability insurance and list Granby Ranch Amenities LLC as additionally insured.
- Once approval is granted and before flight occurs please notify Mountain Patrol Dispatch in person or via phone 970-887-5170.
